



# Imagine! Planning Survey

January, 2021

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### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

#### **OBJECTIVE**

- > To effectively plan for the future, we need to know what the people we serve want for their lives, and the challenges they face. The objective for this survey was to gather information about the people we serve to help us develop our next Strategic Plan.
- ➤ By assessing what people want for their lives and the challenges they face, we will be able to identify service gaps and ideal service scenarios. This will help us deliver supports and services that best meet the needs of the people we serve.



#### **FORMAT**

- The participant pool for this survey consisted of all people in services, and their guardians if applicable.
- We sent out three versions of the survey, based on the age of the person in services. One for children ages birth to 5, one for children ages 6 to 17, and one for adults ages 18 and over.
- The questions were developed by a group of the Executive Team representing all of Imagine!'s service areas, and were reviewed by the Imagine! Parents Advisory Group. Each survey contained 3 demographic questions, a series of multiple-choice multi-select questions, and 3 open-ended questions. Each multiple-choice question had an "other" option, where many respondents left comments as well.
- The survey period ran for four weeks, from 12/28/20 through 1/22/21.

#### **OVERALL RESULTS**

- We sent the survey out to 3285 people in total: 2930 people in services, and 355 guardians
- > Overall, we received 288 survey responses between the three versions of the survey. Our overalfal response rate was 9%.

### Survey for People in Services Ages Birth - 5

#### **Demographic Questions**

- Person completing survey
  - o 93% were completed by the child's parent
- Age of person receiving services
  - o **31%** were age 2
  - o 22% were 3 years old
- > City of person receiving services
  - o 40% of respondents live in Longmont
  - o 19% live in Boulder
  - o 14% live in Lafayette



#### Multiple-Choice, Multi-Select Questions

- If you don't currently receive the support and services you need for your child with a developmental delay or disability, what other services do you need?
  - o 41% said they are currently receiving all the supports and services they need
  - o 38% said that they need therapy service (such as speech, physical, or occupational)
- What would help you make and keep a support system?
  - o 33% said that they don't need support in this area
  - 43% said that spending time with friends/family would help them
  - o 28% said that parent support groups would help
- What childcare setting would best meet your child's needs?
  - o 47% said that they don't need support with finding childcare
  - 48% said they would like an integrated setting for their child, versus just 5% who are looking for a childcare setting that serves only people with disabilities or delays
- What activities that you like to do for fun are sometimes hard for you to do?
  - o 33% said that activities are not hard for them to do
  - 41% responded "shopping"
  - o 33% responded "vacations/travel", and 28% said "visiting friends/family"
  - Only 5% said "online groups"
- What makes it hard to do these activities with your child with a developmental delay or disability?
  - o 45% said that they do not have a hard time doing activities with their child
  - o 28% said that the behavior of their child makes it hard
  - o 24% said it was because they don't have enough childcare
- Do you have any issues traveling outside your home?
  - o 79% responded that they don't have issues with transportation
  - No answer for this question received more than 5% of responses
- What makes it hard to use technology (like an iPad, smart phone, computer, or the internet) to support your child with a developmental delay or disability?
  - 55% responded that they don't have any issues using technology
  - o 21% said that they don't know what kind of technology is good for their child
- What do you need more information about?
  - 41% said that they have all of the information they need



- o **31%** want more information about community help not offered by Imagine!
- o 29% want more info about how services and supports change at different points in their child's life
- o 29% want more information about the supports and services offered by Imagine!
- What makes it hard to understand the services available to you?
  - o 55% don't need support in understanding the services available to them
  - o 16% would like one-on-one time with someone experienced in the field
  - 16% said that people don't explain the services to them

#### **Open-Ended Questions**

- What's the best part about living in this area with your child with a developmental delay or disability?
  - Supports/Services: Imagine! services specifically, and Imagine! therapy services in particular
    - "The best part about living in this area is that the providers come to you. They work around your/one's schedule. The providers we have worked with are awesome!"
    - "Have hope about helping my child learn to communicate better"
  - School: great school district; good support from school
  - People/Community: community is helpful and safe; people are accepting and don't discriminate
  - Outdoors: love the open space, parks, and outdoor activities
- What improvements would help you live successfully in this area with your child with a developmental delay or disability?
  - Activities: reduced rates for community activities
  - Groups/Classes: education/counseling for parents/families; specialized parent support groups
  - Supports/Services: hard to get info after Early Intervention program; more in-person services
  - People/Community: more acceptance; more open and inclusive
  - Living Situation: rental assistance
- What would you like Imagine! to know about how we can help support your child with a developmental delay or disability?
  - o **Information**: more printed resources such as milestones by age; more info for what happens at transitions
  - People/Community: partner with local companies for reduced rates
  - o **School**: help advocate for more support/accommodations from school
  - Services/Supports: more support after age 3; more help with financial burdens; therapy/support
    outside of school; behavioral support
    - "We had a fantastic experience with Imagine. Thank you for the excellent support!"



### Survey for People in Services Ages 6 - 17

### **Demographic Questions**

- Person completing survey
  - o **96%** were completed by the person's parent
- Age of person receiving services
  - o 42% of responses were for clients ages 6 to 9
  - o 33% were for clients ages 15 to 17
- City of person receiving services
  - o 29% of respondents live in Longmont
  - o 21% live in Boulder
  - o **15%** live in Broomfield
  - o 15% live in Lafayette



### Multiple-Choice, Multi-Select Questions

- If you don't currently receive the support and services you need for your child with a developmental delay or disability, what other services do you need?
  - o 29% said they are currently receiving all the supports and services they need
  - o 35% said that they need childcare service
  - o **27%** said that they need behavioral services
  - o 24% said that they need therapy services (such as speech, physical, occupational, etc.)
- What would help you make and keep a support system?
  - o 11% said that they don't need support in this area
  - 42% said that spending time with friends/family would help them
  - o 38% said that group outings would help
  - o **36%** said that parent support groups would help
- What after-school and school break/summer camp would best meet your child's needs?
  - o **16%** said that they don't need support in finding childcare
  - 51% said they would like an integrated setting for their child, versus 24% who are looking for a childcare setting that serves only kids with disabilities or delays
  - o 36% need help finding a list of after-school programs or camps for their child
- What activities that you like to do for fun are sometimes hard for you to do?
  - Only 7% said that activities are not hard for them to do
  - o There were 8 answers that more than 20% of respondents selected
  - 47% responded "going out to eat"
  - o 45% responded "entertainment"
  - 44% responded "vacations/travel"
  - o 42% responded "shopping"
  - 40% responded "sporting events"
  - Only 11% said "online groups"
- What makes it hard to do these activities with your child with a developmental delay or disability?
  - o Just 11% said that they do not have a hard time doing activities with their child
  - o 51% said that the behavior of their child makes it hard
  - o 29% said it was because things like light and sound are too intense for their child
  - 29% said it was because they worry about people judging their child



- 25% said it was because they don't have enough childcare, and 25% said it was because they didn't have enough support staff
- Do you have any issues traveling outside your home?
  - o 64% responded that they don't have issues with transportation
  - o No answer for this question received more than 10% of responses
- What makes it hard to use technology (like an iPad, smart phone, computer, or the internet) to support your child with a developmental delay or disability?
  - o 40% responded that they don't have any issues using technology
  - o 11% said that they don't know what kind of technology is good for their child
  - In the comments, several people noted that technology brings behavioral challenges for their child.
     Others said that their child needs a lot of supervision when using tech, and they are not always able to provide it.
- What do you need more information about?
  - o Just 11% said that they have all of the information they need
  - A whopping 62% want more information about how services and supports change at different points in their child's life
  - o 53% want information about planning for other aspects of their child's future
  - 49% want more information about community help not offered by Imagine!
  - 40% want more information about the supports and services offered by Imagine!
- What makes it hard to understand the services available to you?
  - o 29% don't need support in understanding the services available to them
  - o 20% would like one-on-one time with someone experienced in the field
  - o 16% said that they have a hard time understanding the forms and papers given to them
  - o 15% would like help from someone who has personal experience with a child with a disability or delay
  - In the comments, some noted that they have difficulty understanding Imagine! forms

#### **Open-Ended Questions**

- What's the best part about living in this area with your child with a developmental delay or disability?
  - "Colorado and Boulder County specifically are excellent for caring for individuals with developmental delays."
  - Outdoors: love the nature and good weather in this area
  - People/Community: people are accepting and non-judgmental
  - School: great school district; schools are support and inclusive
    - "We have found great educational supports through the school system and she has been fortunate to have always had a team that has gotten to know and support her specific needs and leverage her strengths."
  - Supports/Services: Imagine! services specifically, and Imagine! Family
     Support grants in particular



- What improvements would help you live successfully in this area with your child with a developmental delay or disability?
  - Activities: more activities for specific groups (e.g., higher functioning, middle/high schoolers); more sensory activities; more group activities; need an activity calendar
  - Groups/Classes: connecting families of children with similar challenges; specialized parent support groups; classes on social skills; classes to help typical kids be more inclusive
  - Living Situation: more affordable housing



- o People/Community: better accessibility in buildings; an indoor space to play and do activities
- School: advocacy in the IEP process to encourage more school participation
- Supports/Services: more integrated programs; after-school care; tutoring at home; respite
  - "I wish there were more of an integrated program. My child really responds to their typical peers and it is a large piece of their IEP -- they just blossom when a typical peer is there with them."
- What would you like Imagine! to know about how we can help support your child with a developmental delay or disability?
  - Classes/Groups: classes on social skills; help for non-verbal kids; help finding friends for their child
  - Information: more Spanish-language resources
  - People/Community: help local businesses be more open to kids with I/DD
  - School: help advocate for more support/accommodations from school; support for online school
  - Services/Supports: summer program similar to school; more therapies and groups for kids on the spectrum who don't have intellectual disabilities





### Survey for People in Services Ages 18 and Over

### **Demographic Questions**

#### Person completing survey

- o 37% were completed by the person's parent
- o **34%** were completed by the person's guardian
- o **21%** were completed by the person in services
- o 16% were completed by the person in services with help

#### Age of person receiving services

- o 30% of responses were for clients ages 18 to 29
- o 21% were for clients ages 50 to 59
- o 19% were for clients ages 30 to 39

#### City of person receiving services

- o 47% of respondents live in Longmont
- o 13% live in Broomfield
- o 10% live in Boulder



#### ➤ Where would you like to live?

- o 46% said that they are currently living where they want to live
- o 29% would like to live in their family home
- o 23% said that they would like to live in their own apartment or home
- Just 5% said that they want to live in someone else's home

#### What makes it hard to live where you want to live?

- o 53% said that they are currently living where they want to live
- o 13% said they can't afford to live on their own
- o 13% responded that they only feel safe living in their family's home
- In the comments, several people said that they are happy where they are. Others said that they are not yet ready to live more independently.

#### Who would you like to live with?

- o 33% said that they would like to live with family
- o 26% said they would like to live with a caregiver
- 14% said they want to live with roommates
- o 13% said they would like to live with their partner

#### What support would you like to have at home?

- o **37%** said that they want someone to live with them
- In the comments, several people said that they are happy with their current supports. Some said that
  they need 24/7 supervision. Others talked about the kind of support person they would want to have,
  specifically someone who shared the same interests as they did.

#### What is your ideal job? This may be the job you already have, or may be something different.

- o 30% said a part-time job was their ideal job
- o **22%** said a "group" job with full-time staff support
- o 10% said they wanted a full-time job
- o 17% said they don't want a job
- Just 14% said they don't think they can get a job





#### > If you don't want to work or don't think you can get a job, why is that?

- 18% already have a job
- o 26% want to work but can't
  - 10% worried about losing benefits
  - 9% don't think there are jobs they can do
  - Many respondents said in the comments that they couldn't work due to medical issues
- Several people noted in the comments that they were already retired

#### Do you currently have a job, or did you have a job before COVID?

- o 47% said they do not currently have a job, or did not before COVID
- o **38%** said they did have a job, or did before the pandemic
  - Of the 70 people who said they have a job, or did before COVID, those jobs were:
    - 46 part-time jobs
    - 21 group jobs
    - 3 full-time jobs

#### What do you like about Day Program activities?

- o **31%** of respondents don't participate in Day Program
- o 39% like doing things that are fun for them (like art, music, or volunteering)
- 38% enjoy making friends and spending time with friends
- 26% like going to events

#### Do you have any issues traveling outside your home?

- 45% of people don't have issues with transportation
- o No answer for this question received more than 10% of responses
- 9% said that they can't afford a vehicle
- In the comments, many people said that their transportation needs are met by their caregivers, but that they would struggle if they needed to rely on public transportation. Some people noted that public transportation can be unreliable, hard to use, and still require them to walk some. Others said that they have a hard time traveling outside their home due to supervision and support needs.

#### What makes it hard to make and keep friendships?

- o **31%** don't have a hard time making and keeping friendships
- o 29% have a hard time communicating
- o 17% have restrictions on what they can do
- o 17% have a hard time making friends
- In the comments, several people noted that they are very social, and do not have a hard time making and keeping friendships. Others said they struggle with people taking advantage of them, or treating them poorly. Some talked about how they are isolated where they live, due to COVID and in general. A few people said that their medical or mental health issues made it difficult.

#### What activities that you like to do for fun are sometimes hard for you to do?

- o 33% said that activities not hard for them to do
- There were 7 answers that more than 20% of respondents selected
- o 38% said "going out to eat"
- o 33% said "shopping"
- o 31% said "vacations/travel"
- o 30% said "entertainment"
- 28% said "visiting friends/family"
- o 26% said "parks/ nature"
- 25% said "sporting events"





Just 7% said "online groups"

#### What makes it hard to do your favorite activities?

- o 29% said that activities not hard for them to do
- 19% said that they don't have a vehicle
- 19% said they don't have enough support staff
- 14% said they don't have enough money
- 13% said they have trouble controlling their behavior
- In the comments many people said that it is hard to do activities because of transportation issues, and specifically because they rely on caregivers to take them places. Several people said that medical issues make it difficult for them. Many people also said that COVID has made it very hard to do activities

#### What makes it hard to use technology like an iPad, smart phone, computer, or the internet?

- o 30% said they don't have any issues using technology
- o 25% said they don't know how to use it
- 11% said they can't use the technology that might help them
- In the comments, many people said that medical issues, such as vision impairments and manual dexterity challenges make it difficult to use tech devices. Others said that they don't have the interest or ability due to mental acuity or age. For some, they have a rights restriction that prevents them from using certain technology.

#### **Open-Ended Questions**

#### What's going well in your life right now?

- Community: doing things like outings, shopping, and recreation, despite COVID
- Relationships: family/partner supports; pets
- Health: good health, despite COVID
- Job: enjoy their job; enjoy volunteering
- Living Situation: home is accessible; home is safe; people said that they are happy with their current living situation (apartment, host home, mobile home, etc.)
- Self: basic needs met; doing things they enjoy; stable behavior; communicating well; getting exercise; learning; gaining more independence
- Services: happy with Imagine! services (Case Manager, Day Program, caregiver, FRE); enjoying virtual/Zoom classes; happy with in-home care

#### What's hard about your life right now?

- o **COVID**: 59% mentioned COVID in their response, specifically: being isolated; not being able to do activities or outings; not being able to work or attend day program; miss socializing with friends
- Relationships: family member loss; want more contact with family; hard time keeping friendships;
   want close friends; want a partner; isolation (not just due to COVID)
- Living Situation: don't like who they're living with; uncertainty about the future; hard to keep up
  with household responsibilities
- o **Health**: medical problems; mental health challenges from COVID and in general
- o **Job**: hard time keeping job; want more hours at my job
- Transportation: transportation not reliable/dependable

#### What would you like Imagine! to know about how we can help support you?

- "Happy you asked!"
- o Information: about programs I may be eligible for; about jobs and activities in my area



- COVID: continue 1:1 service until safe; continue virtual services through 2021; bring back day program as soon as possible
- o **Relationships**: want to make new friends and connections
- o **Job**: need a job coach; need job training classes; need help finding/keeping a job
- Living Situation: need help finding roommates/HHP; help finding an apartment with Section 8; help me stay in my current place
- Services/Supports: help finding respite; more specific IP goals; more 1:1 and small groups at Day
   Program; need a back-up plan if family not able to provide care; happy with virtual classes
- o Transportation: need help accessing Via; help around gaps in transportation





























### What after-school and school break/summer camp would best meet your child's needs?




























